Update: HTNC 2021 AGM

The AGM was held on 5th July where we were delighted to finally meet in person and share laughter and cake! Huge thanks are due to our outgoing chairman, **Martin Boffey**, who among other things in the last 12 months, has championed the **Rookwood** cause; created the petition to prevent the **Drill Hall** being redeveloped for housing; and was part of the **Cootes Farm Community** group which at very short notice was able to buy the beautiful community green space near the Coot pub and Londis. Thankfully he is staying on as vice-chairman while also embracing his new roles at Horsham District Council (HDC) as Councillor for Trafalgar Ward and Shadow Cabinet Member for Leisure and Culture.

Christine Costin (HDC) will continue her longstanding support as will **Nigel Dennis for WSCC**. **Tony Hogben** will also attend as newly appointed **HDC Cabinet Member for Horsham Town, Parking and Communications**.

We are delighted that our excellent clerk and treasurer, **Rhoda** and **Isabel** will remain in post and **Maralyn** and **Ben** will remain as councillors. We have also recently been joined long-time resident of Trafalgar, **Olive**, who has been co-opted onto the Council to fill a casual vacancy. **Morag** has been elected the new chairperson, and we each generally take on a different role, for example youth issues, transport, neighbourhood planning, older people's groups, the Riverside Walk or liaising with our excellent neighbourhood wardens, **Alison** and **Maria**.

What's Happening in Trafalgar?

Community

Crime – Jo Shiner became the first female Chief Constable in the history of Sussex last year. She is delighted at the increase in online reporting which helps build up the bigger picture of hot spots. She stresses that although they are not able to reply to every report, please know that your input is much appreciated, so keep it coming! Jo says, “As the National Policing Lead for Children and Young People, it’s really important to me that we don’t unnecessarily criminalise young people - rather we need to educate them.” Another new challenge she flagged up are issues of novice dog walkers in green areas who are unaware of the many impacts they create.

Safety – The Neighbourhood Wardens Scheme is funded from the ‘Special Charge’ collected by Horsham District Council across the three neighbourhoods of Trafalgar, Denne and Forest. Recycling

HDC is now the best District in Sussex for recycling, saving many tonnes in from landfill. Textiles and small electricals can now be collected from your door, (It’s easy book a free collection) and batteries can be tied onto your blue or green bin in a clear plastic bag. **Good furniture** can now be collected next to the tip at Hop Oast Park and Ride where HDC host a re-use shop, working alongside charity Horsham Matters and WSCC. (Open Wednesday to Saturday 10-5pm.)

Recycling Jumble Trail or Give Your Stuff Away Day- This is an idea that is working in some villages e.g. Steyning. Would we like to do the same in Trafalgar? Residents simply put out unwanted goods on a certain day and bring them in if not taken by others.

Trafalgar Recycling points run by volunteers –

Community Energy Fund: If your building (eg a church hall or scout hut), is needing a new boiler, for example, you may be eligible for a grant. See HDC website for details.

Litter: Increasingly, residents take a plastic bag as they walk, and informally litter-pick which is hugely helpful. **THANK YOU!** If you prefer a companion, then join in Adopt-a-Street litter picking.

Rookwood Update

For now, Rookwood has been taken out of the Local Plan, which is still under discussion due to last minute Government changes in the rules. Thank you to the many, many of you who made this happen. HDC have listened and re-organised their cabinet as a direct result of our concerns.

Horsham Blueprint Neighbourhood Plan

The Plan (initiated by the three Neighbourhood Councils) will help to ensure the character of the town is maintained and green spaces are protected, while aiming to improve its prosperity and make Horsham a better place for all ages and abilities. Finally, after many years of hard work and a lot of consultation with residents and businesses the plan has been agreed as sound by an independent government inspector. Now, to come into effect, it has to be approved by the people and businesses of the Horsham unparished area who are eligible to vote. It is hoped that the referendum dates will be announced soon. **It is important that you are registered to vote**; consider whether you might need a proxy or postal vote.

CEE Bill

We have been invited as a council to express support for the CEE Bill by the CEE Alliance. We are currently considering whether to do this. This private members' bill, (the Climate and Ecological Emergency Bill) was initially presented to Parliament in September 2020, and is now supported by 115 MPs from seven political parties, and many councils around the country. Its aim can be broadly described as "The UK restores and regenerates the UK's depleted soils, wildlife habitats and species populations to healthy and robust states, maximising their capacity to absorb CO2 and their resistance to climate heating."

We would value any residents' views on whether or not to lend our support to this.

Horsham District Cycling Forum

(hdcf.org.uk) paid a visit to our September meeting in the form of Francis Vernon, who kindly explained their suggestions for helping residents and visitors to enjoy more safe and active travel in and out of the town centre.

Again, any views of residents would be welcomed.

Urban Foxes

Our neighbourhood wardens report increasing incidents of damage to property by foxes in our area.
