#### Community engagement/events/meetings

Charlie and I joined Silver Bullet at The Coot for coffee and chat with like-minded people. This is a wonderful group for over 55 years, supported by Age UK and fantastic staff at The Coot. Conversations and discussions are held first Thursday of every month all welcome.

A new Horsham District Business Crime Reduction Partnership (BCRP) has been formed and is encouraging local businesses to sign up. Launching initially in Horsham Town Centre, membership will be opened-up across the whole of Horsham District by the end of 2023.



The BCRP will use DISC – a secure app for information-sharing and reporting business crime and anti-social behaviour – that is already used in over 550 towns and city centres nationwide. DISC can be used on mobile phones, includes instant messaging, and reports directly to the police. It enables businesses to upload information, incidents, CCTV images, and photos and acts as a platform to alert others to offenders and issues as well as swift direct crime reporting to the police.

## **Older, Vulnerable People and Young People**

With our Team from Parking Services, the CEOs and ourselves provided a uniformed presence at the junior schools across town. We were able to talk to parents, drivers and young people about the impact of inconsiderate and dangerous parking.

## **Cycling**
