## Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)

As Neighbourhood Wardens (NW) we have regularly patrolled with our PCSOs and continued to share information with them. We completed 21 joint patrols with our local Town Team.

We have shared relevant information with partner agencies to aid in the prevention and reduction of Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) related incidents within the town centre. We have supported a few residents with advice and guidance for those having difficulties with their neighbours and community around them. We continue to encourage members of the public to report all incidents to Sussex Police's website: - <https://www.sussex.police.uk/ro/report/>

We continue to encourage the use of the DISC app which allows businesses to report any ASB or theft in their stores. They then also report to the police. This has been very successful in getting businesses to communicate with each other and creating Police reports. We patrolled with new BID Ambassador supporting local businesses in town centre.

## Older residents, vulnerable people and young people

We provided a Safety Talk to those attending Friendship Fridays at Lavinia House. An opportunity to share experiences, discuss concerns and signpost to relevant agencies.

We have also supported several vulnerable people this month, this has included delivering food parcels and signposting to the foodbanks and community fridge. ## Cycling

This month we have asked 19 cyclists to dismount on West Street, 8 of these dismounted. We continue to educate cyclists and ask them to dismount when observed on pavements and pedestrianised areas. This is predominantly in West Street. We are working with WSCC Highways to address some of these issues. There continues to be a growing number of bike thefts across the town, members of the public can order their own anti-theft stickers from The Bike Register <https://www.bikeregister.com/>
